Picturing KansasOctober 5, 2018-June 1, 2019

From scenic prairies to bucolic farms to the architecture of Kansas' agricultural industry, this exhibition features more than 100 years of works by Kansas artists reflecting a sense of place. Included are works of both seminal and lesser-known artists, with many paintings not previously on view in the galleries.

"Picturing Kansas" will feature early Kansas painter Thomas Johnston; important Kansas artists Birger Sandzen, John Steuart Curry, and William Dickerson; and several women artists, including Shirley Smith, Diana Werts, Barbara Cleary, and Lisa Grossman.

The exhibition is a cornerstone for the museum's popular "Picturing Kansas" school tour program that integrates art, history, environmental and agricultural science, and language arts. An additional tour component at the Riley County Historical Society is available.
