

SCHOOL TOURS GRADES K-6



From scenic prairies to bucolic farms to the architecture of Kansas' agricultural industry, this exhibition will feature more than 100 years of works by Kansas artists reflecting a sense of place. The tour integrates art, history, environmental and agricultural science, and language arts. Teachers can request an emphasis on language arts or science, and activities will develop 21st Century Skills of critical thinking, creativity, communication, and collaboration.
