DISCOVERY

Students will explore exhibits and standards-based activities.

LITERACY



Students will develop visual literacy and critical thinking skills as they think about art.

CREATION



Students will create an artistic product inspired by the artwork they observe.

Curriculum/Standards Connections

All field trips connect to the Kansas Fine Arts Career Standards, including understanding human experiences, using innovation to make decisions, critical thinking, and communicating effectively. Tours also include connections to core science, math, literacy, and/or social studies curriculum. Teachers may request a specific curriculum connection depending on the tour.







Field Trip Program Options

Pre-K - Kindergarten (60 minutes)

Shapes & Colors: Early Art Exploration

Introduction to elements of art such as line, shape, color, texture and more.

Grades 1-5 (90 minutes)

Light & Color: Exploring Light Waves (recommended for 1st grade)

Explore refraction and reflection and discover the science behind light waves and color.

Unlikely Objects: The Art of Seeing

Develop observational and critical thinking skills while exploring art made with unexpected materials.

Prairie & Sky: Picturing Kansas

Discover how Kansas' plants, animals, and environmental factors influence the prairie ecosystem through the works of Kansas artists.

Botany & Blooms: Flowers and Pollinators ("In Bloom" exhibit only through October)

Delve into the life cycle and pollination process of botany through the incredible art of flowers.

Grades 6-12 (90 minutes)

Unlikely Objects: The Art of Seeing

Develop observational and critical thinking skills while exploring art made with unexpected materials.

Artistic Voice: Expressing Yourself through Symbolism

Analyze the ways that artists use symbols for self-expression and find your own voice by adding symbolism to your creative work. This field trip could include a writing and/or art product.
