MANHATTAN — A new exhibition at the <u>Marianna Kistler Beach Museum of Art (https://beach.k-state.edu/)</u> at Kansas State University offers a behind-the-scenes look at art studios from the artists' perspectives.

"Where the Magic Happens: Artists in the Studio" runs through Saturday, October 19, in the Beach Museum of Art's Mary Holton Seaton Gallery West.

Explore the studios of artists through the artists' own eyes in this exhibition of works from the museum's permanent collection. Prints, drawings and other works depicting artists in their studios provide an intimate look at a deeply personal activity: creation. Through these pieces, viewers can learn more about the nuts and bolts of making art.

The exhibition includes tools and other collateral materials used in the studios of Charles Marshall, Herschel C. Logan and Bernard Steffen, among other artists. Light-sensitive works on paper in this exhibition will be replaced during the summer, so be sure to look out for a new set of studio views.

"It is especially fun to have the tools used by some of the artists."
