TRANSFIGURATIONS: REANIMATING ANCIENT **ART OF INDIA**

In this immersive video installation, Lebrun aligns and sequences high-resolution photographs of 12th century sculpture from Southern India, then uses intricate morphing techniques to bring these images to life. The installation includes Vishnu and Attendants, a three-screen animation based on carved temple facades, and Shiva Nataraja (Dancing Shiva) a single-screen animation of cast bronze figures. It is part of Lebrun's larger project, Transfigurations: Reanimating the Past.

This exhibition will allow students to explore Indian/Hindu culture and religion and includes an art project. Please note that Vishnu's attendants are not fully clothed. We would be happy to preview the exhibition with teachers beforehand.
