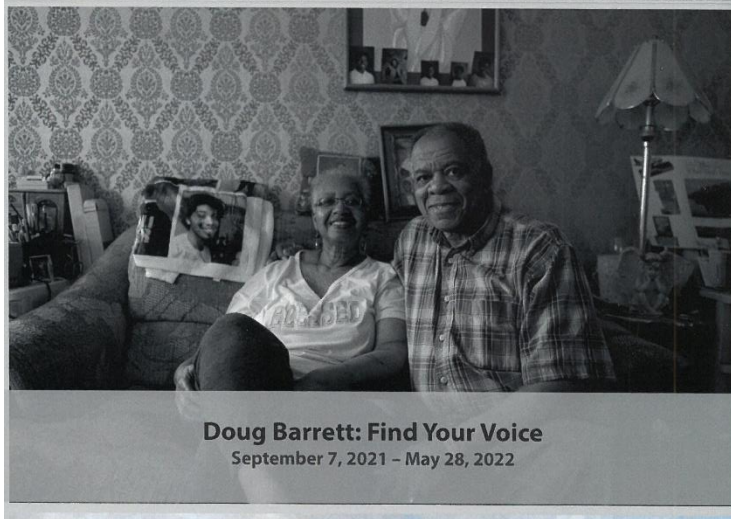
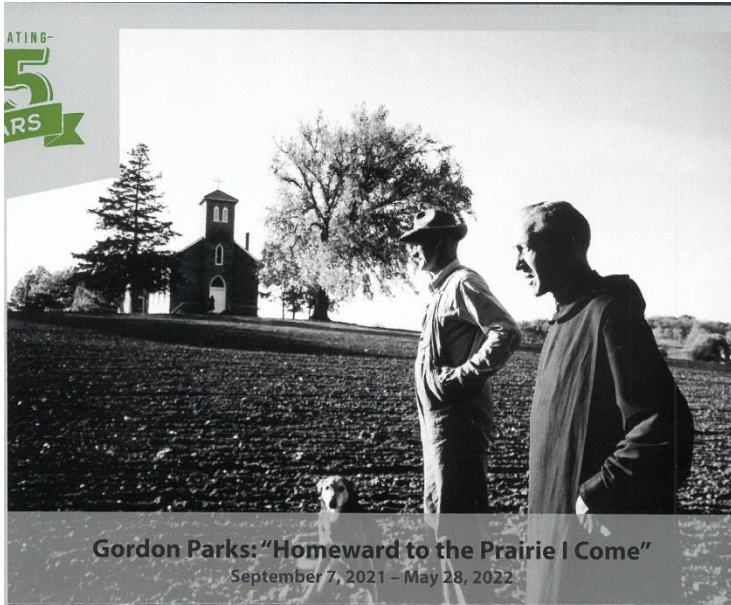


SCHOOL TOURS GRADES 5 AND UP



Work by photographers Gordon Parks and Doug Barrett allow students to explore how artists can use their talent to make a difference in the world.

Internationally famous, Parks was born in segregated Fort Scott, KS. His photo-journalistic work exposed poverty and social injustice, in addition to photographing important Americans and investigating the Kansas heartland, including a series on Manhattan.

Barrett is currently working on themes of homeless veterans, Yuma Street in Manhattan, and social justice rallies.

These exhibitions provide a chance for rich discussion (we will practice principals of Social Engagement developed by K-State's Leadership Studies Program) and will inspire students to find and use their own artistic voices. Students will do visual journaling while visiting the exhibitions.

Tours are free, available Tuesday-Friday. Each tour lasts 1½ hours
