Gallery activities and art projects are designed to explore visual thinking, practice the cross-disciplinary skill of observation, develop expressive language, complement the Common Core/College and Career Readiness, and develop the four “super skills” identified by the Partnership for 21st Century Skills – creativity, communication, collaboration, and critical thinking.
